Have You Looked at Our Ancestry.com UAFA Trees? WebLinks Make Research Easier

hey say behind every great man is a great woman, and these days the reverse is often true too. The Upchurch and Allied Families organization is not only about Upchurches, but also all those families they married into and lived around. This is something that Phil Upchurch was passionate about – not only exploring the many facets of the Upchurch family, but all those other families that created the future generations of descendants.

When I joined the organization a few years before Phil died, he wasn't excited about our Upchurch connection so much as by how many of his Allied Families I also fit into. We were cousins of some sort through at least five other families - Mills, Council, Holleman, Yates, and Perry. Because of this, he asked me to head the Allied Family Tree program.

What is the Allied Families Tree program? It is an effort to create and connect the many trees UAFA has in Ancestry.com so that a researcher can seamlessly navigate through communities, rather than just single families. To do this, Allied Families Tree researchers work on trees for these families, starting with ancestors that migrated to the Wake County, North Carolina area down to present day.

As is often the case, a member of one Allied Family tree will marry into another. In these cases, researchers use WebLinks to link these family trees. WebLinks are located at the bottom of the Sources column on a person's Facts page. If you click on the WebLink, you will be taken to that person on their family's tree. Ideally, it is a two-way connection, with a Web-Link on the corresponding spouse's page (we're still working on that!).

A great example of the power of this is seen in my 4th great grandparents - Mathew Council and Lucetta Upchurch. On the UAFA Robert Council tree, you'll see information about Mathew and his children. If you click on Lucetta,




Education Background

NO NEED TO Worry, Says J.F. Upchurch

"Wish I Could Tell You All the Inside Dope About War, But Regulations Forbid," Writes Former Anchorageite to Friend.

"Wish that I could tell you all the inside dope, but the regulations forbid. Don't worry about the war because we have the Huns going our way now," writes J. F. Upchurch who is in charge of the radio station on Goat island in San Francisco bay in a letter to John J. Longacre of the telegraph and telephone department.

Mr. Upchurch left Anchorage on March 20 with the sixty other recruits and enrolled in the naval reserves upon his arrival in Seattle. He was sent to San Francisco and on April 13 was appointed chief electrician for the island barracks.

He has plenty of time for shows and other sources of entertainment and is off duty Saturdays and Sundays and Wednesday afternoons. He makes his home in San Francisco and goes back and forth each day to his work on the island.

No need to worry", were the reassuring words of James Fairfax Upchurch in a letter to an acquaintance in Anchorage, Alaska regarding the outcome of the first world war. Upchurch was then serving in the Naval Reserves in the San Francisco Bay area. He was born in Steelville, MO to John C. "Jack" and Emily Evans Upchurch. In turn James was the grandson of John Jordan Upchurch, (arguably the most famous Upchurch -RPU). James had made his way from Missouri to Anchorage by 1915 and upon America's entry into the Great War, found himself in the Bay area. He must have liked the area, for by 1920 he had met and married Alice Bloe, and there he and Alice would live out the rest of their days. He and Alice are buried in the Golden Gate National Cemetery.

James Fairfax Upchurch was a descendant of John UVI, Upchurch Clan 14.

P.S. No, James Fairfax Upchurch was not the inspiration for Alfred E. Neuman.
